Sensory Street offers workshops and seminars that present fun ways to support a child's success at home, in school and for life. With the right tools, every child can learn and grow.

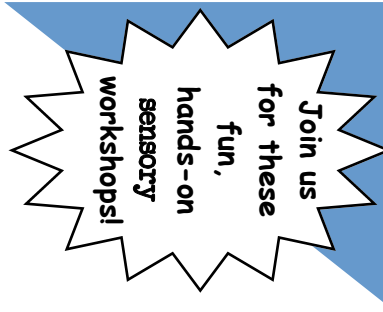
