Topic

Financial planning for special needs kids is especially important: After you're gone, who will handle their financial needs? Leaving an outright inheritance may interrupt a child's much-needed government benefits. You can leave money for your son or daughter, without interfering with their public benefits, with a *Special Needs Trust*. Also called a *Supplemental Needs Trust*, this legal document enables a person with a physical or mental disability (or chronic or acquired illness) to have an unlimited amount of assets held in Trust for his or her benefit. Local attorney D. Kathleen Rus will enlighten us about these Special Needs Trusts: the different types, their purposes, how they operate and how to fund them.



What is PPST?

PPST is a group specially designed for parents and caregivers of children with speech and language delays/disorders. PPST is run and sponsored by the SPEECH PATHways Foundation, a non-profit organization. The first group of its kind in Carroll County, PPST offers parent training and support. Meetings include a meet and greet, a guest lecture on various topics, and Q&A time. Trained professionals and other parents/caregivers are on hand for support and guidance.
