Topic

Not sure if your child is just ignoring you, or truly can't hear you? Concerned about too many ear infections? Heard about auditory processing issues and want more information? Dr. Regina M. Presley and Dr. Nancy E. Hart from Healthy Hearing and Balance will provide an overview of how the ear works and what issues can interfere with normal hearing in children. Effective testing protocols and treatments used to address both temporary and permanent hearing losses will be reviewed. Parents will also have an opportunity to discuss specific concerns.



What is PPST?

PPST is a group specially designed for parents and caregivers of children with speech and language delays/disorders. PPST is run and sponsored by the SPEECH PATHways Foundation, a non-profit organization. The first group of its kind in Carroll County, PPST offers parent training and support.
